A- My favorite book series is Harry Potter. My favorite classic novel is The Great Gatsby. Reading is one of my favorite hobbies.


Q- What would you change about the district? (Not just the school)

4 of the Most Comfortable and Popular Sneakers



Volleyball was invented in 1895 by William G. Morgan. It was designed as an indoor sport for businessmen who found the new game of basketball too vigorous. Morgan called the sport "mintonette," until a professor at Springfield College in Massachusetts noticed the nature of the volley game and proposed the name "volleyball" The original rules were written by Morgan. The game soon proved to have wide appeal for everyone in schools and playground and was later introduced to other countries

In 1916, the YMCA and the National Collegiate Athletic Association NCAA jointly published rules. The first national tournament in the United States was held by the YMCA National Physical Education Committee in Nyc in 1922. The United States Volleyball Association USVBA was formed in 1928 and was recognized as the body governing and normative in the United States.

Did you know RPMS has our very own Volleyball Club? We have 60 Students signed up! Sessions run after school twice a month in the Gym.
